

People Share Information with Aurora

In our continuing efforts to share information with the communities of Labrador, Aurora Energy Resources held Open House sessions between November 19 and 29th in the communities of Nain, Hopedale, Makkovik, Postville, Rigolet, Happy Valley—Goose Bay, and North West River.

Members of Aurora and experts in tailings and radiation were on hand to answer questions about our Michelin Project and uranium mining in general. We are very thankful to the almost 350 community members in the 7 communities for taking their time to visit us at these sessions.

While the topics of discussion varied, the people in attendance were very engaged and eager to hear more about the Michelin Project and to share their own perspectives. We learned a great deal from the communities on a variety of topics.

Some of the common topics raised by community residents addressed tailings storage, radiation and employment opportunities. Tailings are the fine sandy material left over after the uranium is removed from the ore. We described how tailings would be deposited safely in carefully designed facilities approved by the Canadian Nuclear Safety

Commission to ensure the environment and people are protected. We learned that the communities are very interested in training initiatives to help prepare for the possible 400 to 500 employment opportunities at the proposed mine. Community members also shared their thoughts on the use of the proposed road to the Michelin site. And we learned of people's particular interest in the possibility of electrical power from the grid being brought to the coast.

Community members were interested to hear that the Environmental Assessment process provides significant opportunities for members of the public to play an active role in the development of the Michelin Project. Aurora must successfully complete the three year Environmental Assessment before a license to build a mine will be awarded.

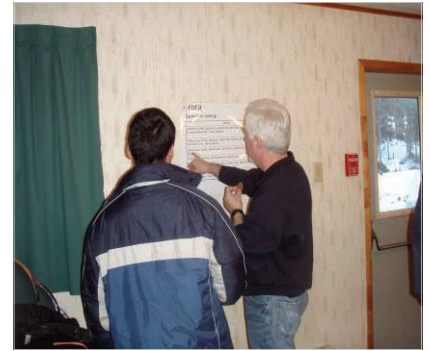
Overall community members told us they were interested to learn more about the proposed Michelin project and specifically expressed an interest in the Environmental Assessment.
